- 4. Describe which language(s) do you speak and at what level? How will the planned study abroad contribute to the development of your language skills? Do you plan to take a language exam when you return home? (max 150 words)

Quality:

You have answered the questions thoroughly and have shown your achievements so far and that you have made efforts to gain international experience during your BBS studies, illustrated with concrete personal examples. Answers are both grammatically and stilistically of high quality. max 20p

The questions were only partially answered and in many cases only general answers were given, with few concrete personal examples to illustrate what the student has done to gain international experience during his/her BBS studies. : max 10p

The answers to the questions are at a general level and there is no information that the student has previously done something to gain international experience during his/her BBS studies. Answers are linguistically undemanding: max 5 p

Relevance:

The student's motivation is convincing and it is clear that he/she has thought carefully about where he/she wants to go and why. He has also thought about the relevance for the development of his language skills. max 20 p

The student's motivation is moderately convincing and it is not clear that he/she has thought carefully about where he/she wants to go and why, and how he/she wants to develop language skills. max 10 points

The student's motivation is not very convincing and it is not clear that he/she has thought carefully about where he/she would like to go and why, and how he/she would like to develop his/her language skills. max 5 points
